### **Médecins Sans Frontières | [doctorswithoutborders.org](http://doctorswithoutborders.org)**

- Rushing over 225 metric tons of emergency medical supplies to Ukraine.
- Donating supplies to hospitals in Kyiv, Odesa, Zhytomyr, Cherniv, Bilal Tserkva, Fastiv, Mykolaiv, Dnipro, Zaporizhzhia, Pokrovsk, and Kramatorsk to treat war-wounded and deal with mass casualty incidents (a large number of patients arriving at the same time).
- Training hospitals to deal with mass casualty incidents and to treat war wounds.
- Providing training to health centers in the periphery around Kyiv on supporting people with chronic diseases and other non-trauma medical needs.
- Establishing a telephone hotline in Kyiv to help people with non-communicable diseases get medication delivered at home.
- In Odesa, an MSF anesthetist/resuscitator is providing training to general practitioners and nurses.
- Providing patient care on board a medical train.
- Providing medical care via mobile clinics.
- Providing support in Lviv to one of the larger hospitals to run its burns unit.
- Providing basic and mental healthcare.
- Donating cold weather items in Lviv to civil society organizations supporting displaced people and refugees.
- Sending experienced emergency and specialist medical staff.
- Supporting hospitals and doctors remotely.

### **Mercy Corps | [mercycorps.org](http://mercycorps.org)**

- Mercy Corps is on the ground in Ukraine, Romania, and Poland, providing funding to local organizations that know their community needs best and working to meet urgent humanitarian needs.
- They are connecting people on the move with information, such as where to access basic services, information on safe routes, and their legal rights.
- Mercy Corps is providing emergency cash assistance to Ukrainian refugees to meet their urgent needs in transit - likely through Romania, Poland, and Moldova.

- They hope to provide emergency cash inside of Ukraine, which will depend on the stability and accessibility of local markets as well as cash liquidity.
- Local organizations Mercy Corps is supporting are distributing items like medical supplies and food staples, including into eastern Ukraine, and supporting marginalized groups like third-country nationals crossing into neighboring countries.
- **Mercy Corps provided humanitarian assistance in Ukraine following the 2014 conflict, helping over 200,000 people with emergency cash, food, water, and sanitation supplies.**

- Project HOPE is sending over two tons of essential medical supplies and medicine to help Ukrainian refugees in Poland, Romania, and Moldova
- They are working to help children with disabilities and medical conditions to receive the care they need in hastily constructed refugee camps
- Providing mental health assistance to those fleeing violence and expanding its programmatic footprint inside Ukraine
- Aiding in the coordination and distribution of over 100 pallets of medicine and medical supplies including hygiene kits, needles, Interagency Emergency Health Kits (IEHKs), insulin, daily medicine, and more in Lviv for onward distribution westward to hospitals in need
- Identifying hospitals and schools in the Kharkiv area for rehabilitation

Spirit of America is working closely with US military and State Department personnel in Poland to meet the urgent needs of Ukraine’s Armed Forces on the front lines. We are providing medical supplies and equipment, including first aid kits, for Ukrainian soldiers and field medical personnel. We expect to provide emergency communications gear. We are also working with US Special Operations Forces to provide emergency assistance to Ukrainians displaced by the fighting.

- Providing vital humanitarian supplies. On 5 March, the first batch of humanitarian supplies arrived in western Ukraine, from UNICEF's Global Supply and Logistics Hub in Copenhagen, including personal protective equipment to protect health workers from COVID-19 as they respond to the critical health needs of children and families, as well as desperately needed medical supplies, including medicine and first aid kits.
- Working with municipalities to ensure that there is immediate help for children and families in need.
- Supporting mobile teams providing child protection services and psychosocial care to children traumatized by the chronic insecurity.
- Continuing emergency response efforts to address the COVID-19 outbreak, including by working with municipalities to increase COVID-19 vaccination rates, and by strengthening awareness-raising and capacity-building efforts.
